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OPENING WORD

We entered the year 2021 with fear of what else can be expected from the pandemic. The year 2020 was the year when pandemic was all we heard about. There was not much time and energy to focus on the areas without a good healthcare system or government support. Furthermore, it seemed as if the pandemic was avoiding Africa in 2020... However, when Europe was slowly getting back to its feet and the restrictions were loosening up, the pandemic shifted to areas less visible to the mainstream media. In 2021 the pandemic shifted focus and Bookfeeding libraries and the volunteers in the communities were hit in full scale.

Most of our community libraries had to be closed for months at a time, they had to limit their activities and avoid gatherings. Schools were closed and there was very little we could do to help. The year was anything but what we had imagined. The impact the pandemic had was felt straight from the beginning.

As a result of the situation, we had to postpone or pause construction of some projects, limit the transport of books and many volunteers who were so happy to escape the lockdowns of Europe and visit Bookfeeding libraries were unable to go due to the travel restrictions.

Yet, we did not give up. Maybe slowed down – for the time being – but not give up. We started two new libraries - in Ghana and Uganda and finished one library in South Africa.

Despite the challenges we were still able to send volunteers to Uganda and Tanzania and organize a book collection in the Czech Republic, which resulted in over 350Kg of quality English books which are waiting to be sent to Africa when possible - you can read all about it in this report!

Indeed, Bookfeeding had grown and matured. And now, with a few more wrinkles we are now facing the future more determined than ever before. If 2021 taught us anything, then it is that sometimes it is good to slow down and take that time to reflect, gather energy and new ideas. It also showed us how resilient the communities we work with are. They are strong, determined and patient to bring better education and life to their neighborhoods. And pandemic is not going to stop them.

All this great work would be impossible without all the amazing Bookfeeders who – in their free time and without pay – work tirelessly to make the world a better place and Bookfeeding to be what it is today – and without you, our supporters.



THE LIBRARY

There are seven primary schools and five secondary schools in Rokupr, which are well attended. However, none of the township's primary schools has a library, with the exception of some secondary schools.

This library does not only benefit the pupils of Ahmadiyya Primary School, but also other primary schools and the public in general. Due to the long opening hours, the library can also be used as a place where pupils can spend their free time.



THE LIBRARY

Ampekro Bookfeeding is the only social amenity in the community. The community and the school did not have access to any book until Bookfeeding helped them to start building a library. The library gives people from the community the opportunity to shape their interpersonal skills and to improve their academic performances.

LOCAL BOOKFEEDER

Solomon is our local bookfeeder, who is responsible for this project and its implementation.

LOCATION

The library is located in Ghana, in a rural community called Ampekro in the Assin South District of the central region. The library supports a population of about 500 people including people in the surrounding communities. Users of the facility mainly include students from both the basic and second cycle schools as well as tertiary students.



ONGOING ACTIVITIES AT THE LIBRARIES

Pilot Sanitary Workshop

Menstruation is a topic surrounded by negative stigma. Many girls and women in Africa have limited access to hygienic facilities and menstrual products often resulting in shame and limitations concerning their day-today life at work or school. Due to the prevalence of this issue, we made the decision to organize workshops on making reusable sanitary pads as these have a small environmental impact and are affordable (half a dollar for one pad). We organized our pilot project in Kasese, Uganda in March 2021 where a tailoring workshop and discussions surrounding the topic of menstruation were held. A group of ten teen mothers took part in this 10 day long workshop which ended up being a success for everyone involved and is still on-going.

Workshops on Menstruation

At the beginning of the year, women met at the library in Visiwani (Tanzania) for several workshops on menstruation. The library provided a safe space to talk about different taboos and concerns that women experience related to menstruation. After the talks, we learned together how to make reusable sanitary pads. One of the volunteers, Abi, continues to spread the workshops within the surrounding Masaai villages.





ONGOING ACTIVITIES AT THE LIBRARIES

Basketball

The Ukonga library is located on the outskirts of Dar es Salaam. It is run by members of the Ukonga Basketball academy and lies close to the Juhudi Primary School and Ukonga Primary School. The library is located in a green yard close to the dorms of the basketball academy and the basketball court. The basketball community is very welcoming and has a vital role in promoting a sport that has a minority position in comparison to football, with a much bigger tradition and popularity in Tanzania.





Collecting Plastic

Solar Chimney Drier

In one month, volunteers Maya and Austin, together with the community around Majengo library, have managed to build a solar chimney dryer. The dryer provides efficient drying even in hazy or partly cloudy conditions. Constructing the dryer is simple, and it can be made from low-cost, locally sourced materials.


